ABOUT THE JLHP

Mission Statement

The Junior League of High Point, Inc. is an organization of women committed to promoting volunteerism, developing the potential of women, and improving the community through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers. Its purpose is exclusively educational and charitable.

JLHP Fun Facts

- Founded in 1928 with 24 members.
- Currently, over 400 members strong in the High Point community.
- Joined The Association of Junior Leagues International in 1952.

JLHP Contributions Through The Years

Child and Adult Health

- Contributed to the the Mental Health Association in the 1960s.
- Helped staff High Point Memorial Hospital from 1961-1985.
- Formed CHILDWATCH, a project to prevent child abuse.
- Formed and assisted with the Women's Resource Center in conjunction with the YWCA.
- Established Kids in the Kitchen in 2006, a program to teach kids health and nutrition.

Arts and History

- Involved in plays, including support for the North Carolina Shakespeare Festival and the Teachers Arts Grants Program beginning in 1932.
- Raised funds and managed the restoration of the Haley House at the High Point Museum, the oldest structure on its original foundation in Guilford County.
- Purchased, preserved and renovated a 100-year-old landmark home on Main Street, The Briles House. The house currently serves as The Junior League of High Point, Inc. Headquarters.

Education

- Developed the Center School for Exceptional Children, serving special educational needs and improving special education in public schools.
- Supported Kids on the Block puppet troupe to teach children about abuse.
- Awarded Teacher Mini-Grants for over 24 years in excess of \$182,000.
- Developed Children's Learning Center, a literacy enhancement program, in partnership with the High Point Museum.

Social Services

- Conducted a needs assessment that later became the Family Service of High Point in 1940.

Environment

- Established the Piedmont Environmental Center.

The Terry Family

Randall Bryant Terry, Sr. moved to High Point, North Carolina around 1904 from Richmond County. Terry had served as Secretary-Treasurer for the Piedmont Table Company up until the time he and R.F. Dalton of Snow Lumber Company, formed the Dalton Furniture Company in 1905.

The factory, located at 101 Hamilton Street in High Point, had a large contract for wooden post or-ice desks by the United State government early on. The company continued to grow and expand and broaden to include pedestal extensions and five-leg extension tables, parlor, center, library, and office tables in any finish desired. Kitchen tables were also available with white poplar tops. Living room tables were added to the product mix. Terry purchased the entire Dalton Furniture Company during 1913, after successfully managing the firm for a number of years.

In 1908, Terry married Nan Carr Heitman, and they had one daughter, Nancy Carr Terry in 1911. ***Mr. and Mrs. Terry built their home together at 200 West Farriss Avenue in High Point. The 1912 Tudor revival home was complete in 1913, and the Terry family moved in.*** Mrs. Terry passed away in 1928, leaving her husband and daughter behind.

Terry became the second Vice-President on the board of directors for the building association in High Point and acquired the High Point Enterprise building in 1920, and became a partner in the newspaper itself in 1921.

Having been instrumental in laying the groundwork for the furniture exposition building in High Point, and owning an interest in the building, Terry was also an organizer and director for the High Point Hotel Company, which oversaw the funding and building of the Sheraton Hotel on Main Street in High Point.

During 1931, Terry married Dorothy P. McGrath and three years later they announced the birth of their son, Randall B. Terry Jr.

After Terry Sr.'s death in 1955, Terry's son and his mother, Dorothy, managed family business interests at the High Point Enterprise and The International Home Furnishings Center until Mrs. Terry's death in 1997.

Terry Jr. cherished the companionship of nine Golden Retrievers named for figures in Greek mythology. He lived in the estate with his dogs and continued with his newspaper and furniture showroom interests until his death in May 2004.

After his death, the Golden Retrievers lived in the home until the last one passed away in the summer of 2014.

The R. B. Terry Estate was built in 1912

When renovating the house, Mrs. Terry's notebook was found in the kitchen cabinets. The book includes recipes, party plans, and notes. (See the actual notebook in the kitchen.) A melon ball signature drink, inspired from Mrs. Terry's recipe will be served tonight at the Grand Opening Party.

The last Junior League of High Point Showhouse was in 1980, 35 years ago. The theme for the house was "A Manor for Living".
